- These results place KHHS as 9th in Government schools in the state for non-selective comprehensive schools.
- Overall HSC ranking is worked out by calculating number of Band 6 scores / number of exams sat. (Band 6 = score of above 90%). KHHS students sat a total of 612 exams and achieved 114 Band 6 results → for 2022 KHHS placed 128 overall in HSC rankings from all secondary schools in NSW.
- o The schools focus on writing has once again seen good results in English
 - Results for the Advanced English cohort remain 7 marks above state and 6 marks above our similar schools group.

 - In 2022, 2 year 8 classes participated in an intensive writing focus trial in the subjects of HSIE, English and PDHPE. The results of the trail saw students improve their writing skills by 2 progressions (i.e. Equivalent of going from C grade to A grade).
 - This will continue for all classes in year 8 moving forward.
